The Brisbane Aquatic Centre in Chandler Sports Precinct has long provided a venue for hosting aquatic sports events for athletes of all competition levels, since its construction for the Brisbane 1982 Commonwealth Games.

In addition to its elite event credentials, the centre attracts more than 400,000 community members annually, proudly serving as South East Queensland's home of school, regional, state and national competitions in swimming and aquatic sports.

The Brisbane Aquatic Centre will undergo necessary upgrades to support the National Aquatic Centre in Spring Hill in hosting aquatic program events for the Brisbane 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games.
