

Brisbane International Shooting Centre



Fact sheet August 2025

First developed in 1968, the Brisbane International Shooting Centre sits within the Belmont Shooting Complex, a location well accustomed to hosting international shooting events.

The venue was most recently upgraded to host shooting events for the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games and will undergo further improvements to ensure it is ready to host Olympic and Paralympic shooting events in 2032.

Following the Queensland Government's 2032 Delivery Plan announcement, the Games Independent Infrastructure Coordination Authority (GIICA) will work with the Queensland and Australian governments to progress venue upgrade planning, with the next step the development of a Project Validation Report.
