Features and benefits

Capacity for major sport and entertainment



With a legacy capacity of 63,000 and up to 70,000 for concerts, the new stadium will serve as Brisbane's future home of major sporting and entertainment events.

Transport connectivity



Brisbane Stadium will have exceptional connectivity to nearby existing and planned transport such as Cross River Rail and Brisbane Metro stations, the busway network, major roads and other rail stations.

Preservation of green space



Opportunities to reduce the footprint of the stadium and associated infrastructure will be explored to retain and enhance as much green space as possible, preserving public parkland.
