

The new Logan Indoor Sports Centre is set to become one of South East Queensland's largest, fully accessible, multi-purpose sports centres, and is proposed as a centrepiece of the vibrant Civic and Community Precinct at Logan Central.

Strategically located in one of the region's fastest growing areas, the nine-court venue will provide a sporting legacy to the Logan community.

Designed to provide participation opportunities in a diverse range of indoor sports, the centre will host a variety of sports and provide capacity for 7,000 spectators during the Games.

Beyond the Games, the Logan Indoor Sports Centre will be a dynamic community hub for sport and events. Local schools, clubs, and community members will have access to world-class and accessible facilities, encouraging a new generation of athletes and active communities.

Servicing the rapidly growing community

As Logan's largest piece of community sporting infrastructure, the new indoor sports centre will address the needs of a growing local population expected to reach more than 500,000 by 2041.



A legacy for the region

Beyond the Games, the new centre will serve as a key sporting and community hub, with nine courts across two halls, able to host a range of sports and community events.
