

In readiness for the Brisbane 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games, the new Moreton Bay Indoor Sports

Fact sheet August 2025

Centre will be one of the largest muti-use indoor sports facilities in South East Queensland.

The new venue will be owned and operated by City of Moreton Bay Council. Council has already commenced enabling works on-site in readiness for future construction activities.

Located within the revitalised Mill Precinct, the new venue will provide a flexible and accessible facility well suited to various sports including basketball, netball, volleyball, gymnastics, futsal, pickleball and wheelchair rugby.

Following the Queensland Government's announcement of the 2032 Delivery Plan in March 2025, the Games Independent Infrastructure and Coordination Authority (GIICA) is working with the Queensland and Australian governments and Council to progress the project to procurement and delivery.
