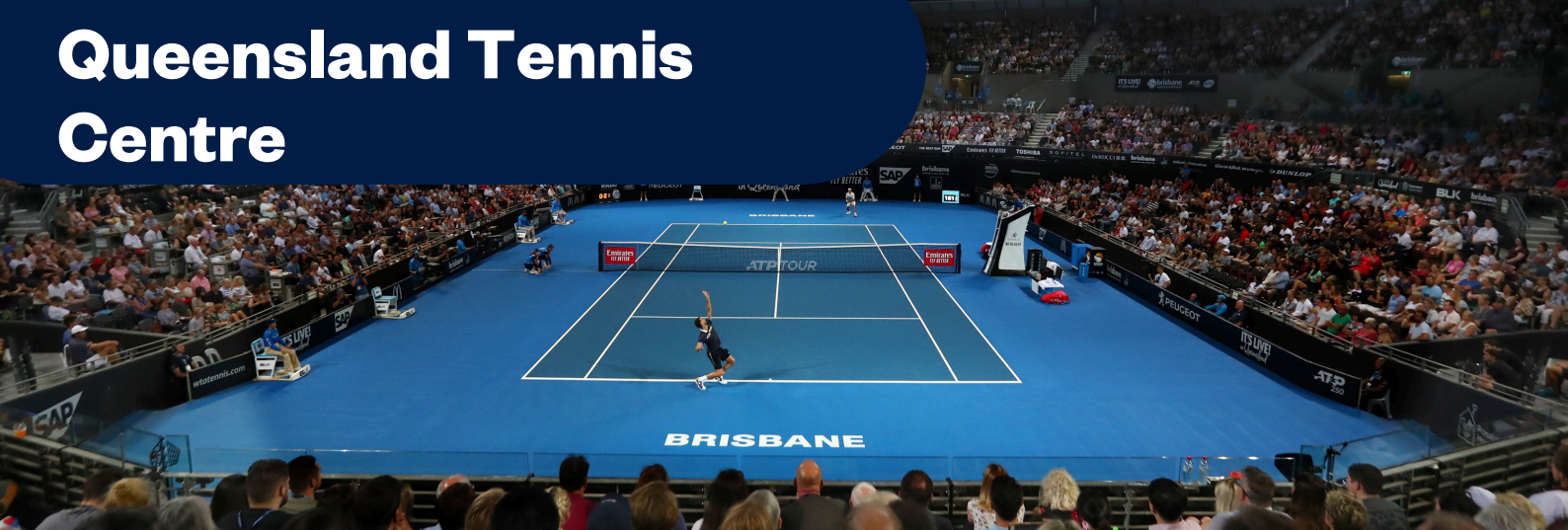


Queensland Tennis Centre

The Queensland Tennis Centre is poised for transformation in preparation for hosting tennis and wheelchair tennis events during the Games.

The proposed upgrade will deliver a new 3,000-seat show court arena and up to 12 additional match courts, greatly expanding the centre's capacity to build on the venue's international reputation while enhancing the home of the National Tennis Academy.

With increased capacity throughout, the upgraded Queensland Tennis Centre will create a fitting legacy for Queensland, which has produced some of Australia's most recognisable tennis players, like Ash Barty and Pat Rafter.
