competition trails, athlete and community facilities. The Sunshine Coast Mountain Bike Centre will be developed on Sunshine Coast Council owned and operated land adjacent to the Parklands Conservation Park. It will form part of a broader integrated nature-based recreation precinct, incorporating the Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service managed Parklands Conservation Park.

In readiness for the Brisbane 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games, the venue will cater to Games events and help meet growing demand for mountain biking and nature trails, creating a legacy that boosts local tourism.

Following the Queensland Government's announcement of the 2032 Delivery Plan in March 2025, the Games Independent Infrastructure and Coordination Authority (GIICA) is working with the Queensland and Australian governments and Council to progress the project. Council will deliver the project, with GIICA to provide oversight throughout the duration of the project.

### Multi-use nature-based recreation



Featuring a variety of trails designed for mountain biking, trail running and multisport events, the facility will enhance access to nature-based recreation for different skill levels and include amenities, bike hire and an on-site cafe.

## Large spectator capacity



The Sunshine Coast Mountain Bike Centre will accommodate 8,000 standing spectators and 2,000 temporary seats during Games events.

### Sustainable focus



The upgrades will integrate environmentally conscious design, ensuring minimal impact on the surrounding natural landscape.
